

#### World War II Recipe for Fruit Scones

In these times of economic struggle, perhaps this recipe could inspire you:

8oz Self Raising Flour mixed with 1 tsp Baking powder

1½oz Lard

2 slack handfuls of sugar

2 slack handfuls of currants

Rub lard into flour and baking powder mix.

Add the rest of the ingredients and use a wide blade to mix into a loose damp mixture. Cut into 2" rounds. Brush with milk if desired. Put onto a greased baking tray.

Bake at Gas 7, Fan 200°, for approx. 10-15 minutes.


Luketide will be celebrated here on Sunday 23rd October and Bishop Paul will preside for us.

#### On how to save electricity in church

#### My dear Nephew Darren

Your church certainly seems to have taken to the idea of green electricity with a vengeance. To have covered the whole of your roof with solar panels was a brave move, and it makes quite a sight — especially when the sun catches them, dazzling motorists on the by-pass and causing multiple pile-ups. I pity the local pigeons, who try to land on it and then do a gentle glissade into the gutters.






A short story from the Bible










The seed on the path was eaten by birds

But some hear what Jesus says and learn from it,






